CURRENT ADVANCED PATHWAY OPTIONS

Advanced Placement (AP)

AP is a collection of courses designed by The College Board to align closely with college-level academic expectations. The College Board is an internationally recognized organization, and many colleges will accept AP Exam scores for college credit.

- ☛ Designed for an edge in college through intensive focus on critical concepts and skills in each discipline.
- ☛ Preparation and practice for the complex, critical inquiry expected in the college setting.

Concurrent Enrollment (CE)

CE is a set of courses designed in partnership with Salt Lake Community College for high school students to earn college credit, a degree, or certificate. Passing a CE course earns college credit through SLCC.

- ☛ Exposure to the pace and expectations of college curriculum.
- ☛ Courses passed can earn college credit and often complete first steps for certain majors or jobs.

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

CTE offers students the unique ability to get specific practical and professional skills that can make the difference in getting a first job or making a college application stand out.

- ☛ Focus on work-based learning experiences and developing competency in high-demand skills for job acquisition or advancement.
- ☛ Pathways to certificates or Associates Degree for topics including Business & Marketing, Health Science, Mechanics, Visual Arts and Information Technology.

Dual Language Immersion (DLI)

DLI is a statewide program for students to acquire high levels of Spanish language proficiency. After passing the AP Spanish Exam in grade 9 or 10, DLI students enroll in Bridge Classes offered in collaboration with U of U.
